The second whiting tournament was a great success. We had 52 anglers on 20 boats attempting to catch the elusive whiting. It was a cloudy day with light winds and warm temperature.

The total number of whiting caught was 32 fish. Eleven boats had no fish, four boats had one fish, and five boats had three or more.

The first prize went to Chris Hutchings and his crew of Shelly Hertz, John Moyer and Vic Rinke. They had a total of 14 fish amounting to 11.5 feet of whiting.

The second place winner with 36" and 3 fish went to Ron Schiver and his crew Larry Heinemann.

The third prize with 44" of whiting as a result of catching four fish was given to John Rafes and his crew of Jeff Erickson and Cathy Erickson.

In the honorable mention category was Joe Perino and crew members Keith Wohltman, Jay Terzis and Mick Haldeman. They had four fish amounting to 45.5 ".

Dick Yeaton and his crew of Walt Turner and John Peona had 3 fish amounting to 32.5 ".

That evening 77 people gathered at Joe & Diane Perino's house for cocktails, beer, finger

Two above slot Snook were caught today in the Imperial River located in Bonita Springs. Both Mike Larsen and Dave Dodd had an exceptional day. Mike caught a 35.75" Snook, a slot Redfish, several trout and a number smaller Snook. Dave caught a 33.5" and a 26.5" Snook and a 21" Spotted Seatrout as well as several smaller Snook.





Ken Robertson (26" Snook), George Stein and Victor Ordija made up the rest of the group and everyone caught fish including a number of large Jacks, smaller Snook and trout. This was the second trip to the Imperial River for the kayak group and we had an exceptional day that took us down to Fish Trap Bay and back to the launch just off US 41;

Baiting Beauties 5 - Ladies' Fishing Event March 12th, 13th and Picnic March 14th 2018

In 2014, the "Baiting Beauties" Ladies' Fishing Event was created to encourage more women's participation in the Marco Sportfishing Club, educate female members about boating and Sportfishing in and around Marco Island and have FUN!

The past 4 events have been tremendously successful and now we're planning "BB5"! The 2018 event will offer a choice of 2 days for our Beauties to get out on the water and fish with their captains and crew, with the picnic and awards to be held on Wednesday, March 14th at Sarazen Park.

Women of all skill levels are invited to participate, from complete beginners to women anglers who appear on the Club's Leaderboard competing with the men. Captains and crew will be there to mentor, teach or just stay out of your way!! And, you don't have to bait your own hook or unhook fish unless you want to!

Here are the details:

<u>Format</u> – Volunteer Captain with a boat, lady angler(s)* and crew. Prizes will be awarded to individual anglers based on their catch – this is not a team event.

*Lady anglers who sign up without a captain will be matched with a boat and captain as needed.

<u>Fishing</u> - Pick <u>ONE</u> of two fishing days - Captains may choose any <u>4 hour time period</u> <u>between 9:30 AM and 3:30 PM</u> - lines in and lines out - on the following dates:

Anglers may fish Monday, March 12th high tide 11:52 AM (2.10 ft), low tide 4:41 PM (1.29 ft)

Anglers may fish Tuesday, March 13th
low tide 5:11 AM (-0.13 ft), high tide 12:05 PM (2.24 ft), low tide 5:23 PM (1.10 ft)

The awards picnic will be held at Sarazen Park on Wednesday, March 14th, from 4:00 PM to 6:30 PM. The picnic is **BYOB** (Bring Your Own Beverages!) - Food is provided by MSC.

Please sign up now for "Baiting Beauties 5" if you are:

- a female Angler
- · a female would-like-to-be Angler
- a male boat Captain with a boat
- a male boat Crew member
- a friend/supporter of the Baiting Beauties who wants to follow the happenings and attend the picnic (a friend is an invited guest, whether Club member or non-member).

Angler entry fee for MSC members is \$20.00, which includes an event gift and a picnic ticket. You may make payment by check (payable to MSC) or cash (call Chris Laimbeer for contact details).

Picnic fee for crew and MSC member friends is \$5.00. Picnic fee for non-member friends who would like to attend is \$10.00. **Angler picnic fee is included in their entry price and captains are free!**

All entries must be received by March 1st, 2018.

- MSC's "No Guide Rule" applies.
- 2. Captains: Captains must be MSC members. Captains and male crew members may fish in this event, but fish caught are not eligible for prizes in the Baiting Beauties 5 Fishing Event. Fish caught by Captains and male crew members that are eligible to be entered in the Leaderboard and Fish of the Month (FOM) may be entered under established MSC fishing rules. Captains are responsible for the safety of their passengers and have overall command of their vessel. Captains are requested to maintain contact with other anglers by monitoring Channel 78.
- 3. Fishing days: Monday, March 12th or Tuesday, March 13th. Participants may choose to fish one of the two days, but not both.
- Event hours: Captains may choose any 4 hour time period between 9:30 AM and 3:30 PM. A fish hooked prior to the end of that 4 hour window may be fought, landed, and measured.
- 5. Fishing License: A State of Florida saltwater fishing license is required. A license may be obtained at Ace Hardware Stores, Walmart, local marinas and on the FWC website. PLEASE NOTE - To keep a legal size Snook a Snook Permit (\$10) must be purchased with your FL saltwater license. You may catch, measure and release a Snook without a Snook permit. If you are a Florida resident and are over 65, you do not need a fishing license or a Snook permit. However, you are required to have proof of residency and age such as a driver's license
- A signed and dated WAIVER, RELEASE AND INDEMNIFICATION form is required to be on record for all non-member anglers and crew who will be aboard a boat on either day of the event. Forms are available from Chris Laimbeer 248.935.0457
- 7. Backwater Fish Species: For this event, participants will target the following six backwater fish species: Pompano, Redfish, Snook, Spotted Seatrout, Mangrove Snapper and Sheepshead. Backwater fish species caught should be identified, measured and recorded on the official tally sheet. An undersized fish is eligible to be measured and recorded but must be released alive. One "Other" category consisting of Catfish and Ladyfish combined is also included. Participants that catch these species need only to count the number of fish caught. Warning! Do not attempt to measure Catfish. Handling Catfish is a hazardous activity.

 Fishing Boundary: MSC Backwater boundaries apply. The approved fishing area are the backwater boundaries established by the MSC Fishing Committee:

Northbound: Gordon's Pass

Westbound: three nautical miles into the Gulf including Gullivan Bay

Eastbound: west of US Highway 41.

Southbound: For this specific fishing event, the South boundary will be Camp Lulu. Fishing for Baiting Beauties 5 is allowed around Camp Lulu, but not past it. Once past Camp Lulu you are in Everglades National Park – the Park is out of bounds.

- 9. Leaderboard Fish and Fish of the Month (FOM): Any fish caught by female participants that are eligible for entry in the MSC Leaderboard or Fish of the month (FOM) must be aligned along a ruler with the entire fish visible and photographed as required by MSC rules.
- 10. Measurements: Measurements of fish caught by female participants will be the responsibility of the Captains and will follow appropriate FWC regulations. Please ensure that all undersized fish that are measured are released alive! Measurements are to be recorded in ¼ inch intervals on the official tally sheets. Circle the largest fish of each caught fish species. Again, Catfish and Ladyfish need only to be counted and NOT measured!
- Reporting: Completed tally sheet information must be emailed to Chris Laimbeer chrislaim@comcast.net by 9 PM on Tuesday, March 13th.
- 12. Awards: Awards will be determined based on largest fish measured in each backwater fish species category and number of combined fish (Catfish and Ladyfish) caught in the "Other" category. Only one award will be given to individual female participants. In the event of a tie, awards will be combined and split.
- 13. Inclement Weather: Safety is paramount for all MSC sanctioned events. All entered captains and anglers will receive an email alert if the weather on either day of fishing is deemed by NOAA to be unsafe. If this alert is posted, no fishing will be allowed on that day. Wednesday, March 14th between 9:30 AM to 1:30 PM will be the backup day only if fishing needs to be cancelled on Monday or Tuesday. The picnic at Sarazen Park, however, will be held rain or shine!!
- 14. Miscellaneous: Remember to bring your hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, drinks and snacks. Most of all enjoy your day on the water and the company of great friends. Our MSC Captains are the best. This event would not be possible without their participation, their love of fishing and knowledge of the water. We wish you a fabulous fishing day and wonderful memories of the Baiting Beauties 5 fishing event!
- 15. Entries and picnic reservations are due by March 1, 2018

CURRENT PICNIC PARKING RULES

Beginning in October 2016, MICA no longer issues stickers for vehicles, rather requires that vehicles have a person aboard with a current MICA membership card. In the past, as a courtesy to the club, they had allowed club members without MICA membership to park in the lot if they were attending the picnic. However, due to complaints from MICA members that the lot was full during picnics, we no longer have that luxury.

Please be aware that the fine for parking on a swale within the vicinity of Sarazen Park is \$95.

HOW TO PARK FOR PICNICS:

- 1) Marco Island residents can purchase an ID card at the MICA office (above the Mutual of Omaha Bank on San Marco and S. Barfield) for \$140. You will need a tax bill or homeowners insurance policy with your name on it. http://www.marcocivic.com/applications/ The ID for your wallet (or on a lanyard) allows you to park any vehicle in the lot. However, it appears that the ID card does not replace the old sticker, ie. you can't let someone else drive your car, they will look at your card to make sure you are in the vehicle. Also, MICA has been leaving notices on cars (including convertibles) that the card must be left on the windshield (not on list of 27 rules or on MICA website). Be aware if someone steals your ID card for following this dumb rule, it will cost you \$25 to replace it. Maybe leave a copy of your card on the dashboard instead?
- 2) Get a Collier County beach sticker from the library or Caxambas boat ramp, and park in the Collier County parking lot, which is adjacent and east of the MICA lot. You cannot park in the MICA lot with this sticker. The stickers are free to Collier County residents, but you need your car registration. Note that in season on very nice days, the Collier County lot could be full by mid-morning. *
- 3) Pay the fee for parking in the Collier County parking lot of \$8 (correct change required). *
- 4) Find a ride from someone who has a MICA card.
- 5) Be aware that MICA rule #15 states: "MEMBERS MAY NOT SHUTTLE GUESTS. MEMBERS MAY ENTER ONCE WITH UP TO FIVE PERSONS ONLY".
- 6) Park at a friend's house/condo that lives within walking distance. I'm not allowed to say who they are (we have many) but you can check the roster. Maybe buy him/her some beers at Happy Hour.

* The Collier County rangers who sometimes patrol the Collier County parking lot, have been telling picnic goers that the lot is for "beach parking only" and not for attending picnics (I doubt if this has been tested in court). So if you park there you should appear as if you are going to the beach. Passing chairs over the fence will probably get you busted. Because of liability issues, ANYONE CLIMBING OVER THE FENCE WILL BE EJECTED FROM THE PICNIC WITH NO REFUND.
