Kayak Fishing at Chokoloskee Bay

March 26, 2019

On this day, the MSC kayak group fished the southern edge of Chokoloskee Bay. Nine kayakers launched from a landing midway along the Chokoloskee Causeway and paddled a little over a mile across the bay and fished the numerous oyster bars and complex channels and mangrove islands that make up this part of the Bay.

Weather was perfect with a mild breeze and a clear sky. The bite was on the slow side, but a good variety of fish were caught including Redfish, Snook, Trout and Mangrove Snappers. Dave Dodd caught a 33.5" Black Drum which was entered on the Leaderboard and Vic Ordija landed a 19.25" Spotted Seatrout, the largest trout caught this day. While no large Snook were caught in this event, several slot size Redfish and legal Mangrove Snappers were reported caught.

Only a small portion of this area was actually fished and this part of the bay will undoubtedly be visited again.





Spring Trout Spotacular Results

Monday, March 18th greeted the anglers with a questionable wind forecast, that ended up being slightly less than expected resulting in an acceptable day to fish. Results varied, with some nice catches reported, while others had a little tougher time finding the fish. Results are as follows:

Naples Kids Clinic

After a “year off” to rebuild the pier following Hurricane Irma, the Naples Kids Clinic was back in full swing again on Saturday, March 9th, with nearly 200 kids and their parents participating in the event. And, in what has become a tradition, 10 members of the Marco Sportfishing Club were on hand to help teach kids (and their parents) the joys of fishing. After registering for the event, each participant spent some time at learning stations, where they were taught about tackle, how to tie knots, conservation, rules and regulations and how to be a good angler. After that, they were taken down to the beach where they had an opportunity to practice casting. Once that was done, they were ready for the real thing, and taken up to the pier where they were given a fishing rod/reel combination that was theirs to keep (courtesy of clinic sponsors and FWC). There were plenty of helpers on the pier and lots of shrimp. The kids got “baited up” and had at it! It didn’t take long until the first fish was pulled in. Then another, and another and another. For many, this was their first time fishing and for others it was their first time actually catching a fish. As you would expect, there were some catfish caught, but there were also plenty of ladyfish, snapper, jacks, trout, pompano, sheepshead, blue runners and lizard fish. One kid even hooked a pelican! All you had to do was look at the kids and their parents to see what a great time everyone was having. Lots of great memories were made this day!





Walker's Marine has partnered with the Make-A-Wish Southern Florida to host the 7th Annual Silver King Classic

Any angler can participate. The only qualifications are that they pay their entrance fee of \$100, carry valid Florida Saltwater License, and that they attend the April 12th Captains meeting.

There will be a mandatory Captains meeting 4/12/2019 at Walker's Marine Showroom starting at 5:00 pm.

The fishing portion of The Silver King Classic will be held based out of the Coon Key Marina on 4/13/2019 – Fishing starts at 8:00 am and ends at 3:00 pm, meaning all measurement ends at 3 pm. If a fish has been landed before 3:00 pm and is waiting for a committee boat to arrive this fish will be measured.

Awards Presentation and BBQ - Walkers Coon Key Marina 4pm-5:30pm following the day of fishing.

All participants are required to abide by all state and federal laws, as well as Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission regulations. Any violations will disqualify the entrant and anyone who may be aiding the violation.

All Checks are to be made out to Make-A-Wish Southern Florida and are tax deductible. Committee members will be collecting and accounting for the proceeds.

The Silver King Classic will be strictly catch and release. The Winner will be determined by catching a Tarpon with the greatest girth. The girth will be measured by committee boats at the point where the fish is caught. Committee members will measure the girth to the nearest quarter inch. In the event of a tie the purse in that division will be split.

You may signup on-line, at the April 5th Fishing Clinic at Rose Hall, or at the Walker Showroom, or at the Captains Meeting.

You can scan the code at the bottom of this page with your phone or tablet to be taken directly to the registration/donation website.

If you can not fish in the event, we ask that you consider making a donation to Make-A-Wish through the donation website or through Walker Marine.

CURRENT PICNIC PARKING RULES

Beginning in October 2016, MICA no longer issues stickers for vehicles, rather requires that vehicles have a person aboard with a current MICA membership card. In the past, as a courtesy to the club, they had allowed club members without MICA membership to park in the lot if they were attending the picnic. However, due to complaints from MICA members that the lot was full during picnics, we no longer have that luxury.

Please be aware that the fine for parking on a swale within the vicinity of Sarazen Park is \$95.

HOW TO PARK FOR PICNICS:

- 1) Marco Island residents can purchase an ID card at the MICA office (above the Mutual of Omaha Bank on San Marco and S. Barfield) for \$140. You will need a tax bill or homeowners insurance policy with your name on it. <http://www.marcocivic.com/applications/> The ID for your wallet (or on a lanyard) allows you to park any vehicle in the lot. However, it appears that the ID card does not replace the old sticker, ie. you can't let someone else drive your car, they will look at your card to make sure you are in the vehicle. Also, MICA has been leaving notices on cars (including convertibles) that the card must be left on the windshield (not on list of 27 rules or on MICA website). Be aware if someone steals your ID card for following this dumb rule, it will cost you \$25 to replace it. Maybe leave a copy of your card on the dashboard instead?
- 2) Get a Collier County beach sticker from the library or Caxambas boat ramp, and park in the Collier County parking lot, which is adjacent and east of the MICA lot. You cannot park in the MICA lot with this sticker. The stickers are free to Collier County residents, but you need your car registration. Note that in season on very nice days, the Collier County lot could be full by mid-morning. *
- 3) Pay the fee for parking in the Collier County parking lot of \$8 (correct change required). *
- 4) Find a ride from someone who has a MICA card.
- 5) Be aware that MICA rule #15 states: "MEMBERS MAY NOT SHUTTLE GUESTS. MEMBERS MAY ENTER ONCE WITH UP TO FIVE PERSONS ONLY".
- 6) Park at a friend's house/condo that lives within walking distance. I'm not allowed to say who they are (we have many) but you can check the roster. Maybe buy him/her some beers at Happy Hour.

* The Collier County rangers who sometimes patrol the Collier County parking lot, have been telling picnic goers that the lot is for "beach parking only" and not for attending picnics (I doubt if this has been tested in court). So if you park there you should appear as if you are going to the beach. Passing chairs over the fence will probably get you busted. Because of liability issues, ANYONE CLIMBING OVER THE FENCE WILL BE EJECTED FROM THE PICNIC WITH NO REFUND.
