

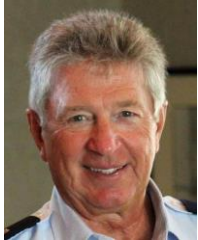

President's Message for May 2020



April 2020, the longest month ever...

Things have been very quiet here on Marco this month. Everyone's staying at home and adhering to the Covid-19 restrictions. The beaches were closed and the season ended rather abruptly. All of our club events were cancelled or postponed.

Many of our members still on-island have managed to get out and do some fishing. We have a few new leaderboard entries this month in spite of the lockdown. Members are practicing social distancing on their boats by fishing alone or with their spouses. The weather has been nice, but really windy and that has had a negative impact on fishing. Most members have used the time to perform maintenance on their homes and boats.

In April, we were fortunate to add Jim Scarpa to the MSC Board of Directors and welcome him as our new Offshore Coordinator. May Month Long Fishing Madness

OK, we have been locked in our houses/condos for over a month. We have rearranged our socks three times and even found that missing one from two years ago. I have cleaned out my files till smoke started to pour out of my Shredder. My wife said I had to do something productive, so I have grown a beard. Now even my computer does not recognize me.

The cure is to get out fishing in a “socially responsible way”. To that end the Marco Sportfishing Club has set up a fun event for the month of May that we can enjoy and still feel we are being responsible. This event is open to all, both Backwater and Gulf fisherman. There will be four targeted fish, four for Gulf and four for the Backwater anglers. If you want, you can fish as many times in May as the wind permits. You can fish with a partner, a significant other or by yourself (not recommended for Gulf fishing). You back water guy’s and gals can fish off your docks.

The cost is \$10 and all the prizes are individual. Each entrant can win two Prizes. I guess if you wanted to fish Backwater and Gulf you could win Four prizes. In total there will be 16 prizes, all individual, with no Boat prizes. The fish we will be after for backwater will be Snook, Redfish, Trout and Sheepshead. You Gulf guys will be after Red Grouper, Cobia, Permit and Snapper(any). Each fish will receive a First and Second Prize based on a turned in.

Photo with fish on a ruler (like normal) and any size can be submitted. We trust you to release the under and oversized fish. Fish caught can also count towards the fish of the month contest and the Annual Leader board.

Once we received your \$10 check you can begin submitting Photo’s using the Fish of The Month and Leader Board mechanism run by George Wittman. Catch a bigger fish two days later, send it in. Check online, George will be doing a weekly (for May) update the Contest chart. First Prize for the largest of each species will be \$100 with a second Prize of \$50.

You will be receiving shortly (if not already) an E blast on this event. To make it even more exciting the club has been working on getting the local Gas price down.

A Story About Charlotte Harbor but it could be titled Marco Island

This month I am writing about some things I've seen happening in our fishery. These things have been happening slowly for several years. A few weeks ago I took Water LIFE editor Mike Heller and his brother-in-law Greg out fishing. We actually had a very good trout bite, however when we tried for a redfish, it was easy to see changes in the Harbor first hand. The past several years we have seen an invasion of an algae that was not here before. **This hair-like green slime, has slowly moved onto our local flats and is suffocating our turtle grass beds. I first noticed it on the East side of the Harbor and now it's made its way up the Peace River. I've been told it's a filamentous algae. This type of algae is attracted to high phosphorus and nitrogen levels. I'm not a biologist or scientist, but I'm pretty sure fertilizer runoff plays a huge roll in the introduction of this algae in our waters. Hurricane Irma dumped massive amounts of freshwater into our ecosystem in 2017.** I know, I said earlier, it's been several years, but just maybe this was the same time this algae bloom started. I'm not great at remembering specific dates of events, however I do know that during Irma we lost a great deal of our grass flats. The volume of freshwater rushing through the creeks onto the flats washed away massive areas of grass. The worse part is these grasses take years to replenish themselves, if at all. Irma also washed out all the chemicals and nutrients that had soaked into the ground around the Upper Harbor. Life in Charlotte Harbor begins with a healthy grass flat. This is where juvenile fish find cover from predator fish. Shrimp and crabs live in the grasses. Predator fish depend on the grass to roam for food. It's a big circle of life that depends on a blade of grass, kind of crazy if you really think about it. A client of mine, Paul Rotter, gave me **a fishing regulation book from 1982. I'm going to tell ya'll what the regulations were for our big 3 that year - snook, trout and redfish. You were allowed to possess 4 snook that had to be 18- inches or more. Redfish was 12-inches, and no bag limit. Trout was 12-inches and also no bag limit. I know, we are talking a way-different time and I know our population was nowhere near what it is today, but it's still just crazy to me to think we went from this to what we have now.** Here's the FWC decision last month: By Executive Order, all three species (snook, trout, redfish) will remain catch-and-release through May 31, 2021, in all waters from the Hernando/Pasco county line south through Gordon Pass in Collier County. These temporary regulations were made to help conserve these popular inshore species that were negatively impacted by prolonged red tide that occurred in late 2017. It's time we take a hard look at what we are doing to our Harbor. If things are not done soon it's going to be too late... if it's not too late already. We can't stop people from moving here, however we can speak up about fertilizers that contain high levels of harmful chemicals. And we can't keep destroying our ecosystem for phosphate. My great grandfather was one of the ol'timers that sold his ranch to the phosphate companies. If he knew then what would've become of it, he would've thought different. Now, MOSAIC, the mining company, is trying to move south and very close to our Harbor. Please say NO to MOSAIC. It's crazy that this much has changed in our fishery since the size and bag limits above, and it happened in pretty much one generation.



Fishing with Live and Cut Bait in the Backwater

It is believed by many fishermen that fishing with live and cut bait is generally more productive than using artificial lures. Most fishermen will also tend to tip their jigs with a piece of shrimp in order to increase fish strikes.

Small Live Bait

Primarily 3 to 5" white bait (includes Pilchards, Greenbacks, Sardines, Threadfin Herring), finger Mullet, small Pinfish and shrimp.

Large Live Bait

Includes 6 to 8" white bait, larger Mullet, Large Pinfish, small Ladyfish, Blue Crabs and Catfish.

Cut Bait

Cut up chunks of Ladyfish, large Mullet, Catfish, Lizard Fish, Squirrel Fish and large white bait.

Small white bait will catch more fish but Large white and cut bait will catch the big Snook, Redfish and Tarpon. The disadvantage of using live bait is the need to purchase, catch and keep the live bait when it is needed. Catfish tails and chunks are a good bait for Tarpon.

Catching Live Bait

Cast netting for white bait, mullet and small Pinfish works well. Live bait caught with a cast net does not hold up well and needs to be used immediately for best results. Some live bait may last until the next day but expect a significant die-off.

Catching large white bait with a sabiki rig works best as the bait is less stressed and holds up better. For example large Threadfin Herring and Pinfish can be kept for days and even weeks if kept in a large pen (5 feet and larger).

Ladyfish to be used for cut bait can be caught by hook/jigs and is an excellent bait but needs to be used immediately or within a few days. Frozen Ladyfish do not stay on a hook well. Small Ladyfish are an excellent live bait for Tarpon and large Snook. Mullet will not take a hook and can be caught using a cast net. Frozen mullet can be used effectively as cut bait.

Rigging Live and Cut Bait

Use a hook size that is tailored to the size of the bait; both for live and cut. Use small hooks (1/0-2/0) for small live bait and larger hooks (3/0-6/0) for large live bait and cut bait. When fishing for Tarpon, larger hooks up to 9/0 can be used with cut bait.

Casting and Freelining Live Bait

Use 7 foot to 7.5 foot rods, 15-20 lb braid and 20 to 30lb Fluorocarbon leaders. Do not use any terminal tackle to join braid to leaders. Hook small live bait through the

nose(sideways) so as to not suffocate your bait. You can also hook live bait through the tail which forces the bait to swim towards the shallows. A split shot(s) may be added if fishing deeper depths. Using a popping cork is a very effective method when fishing small white bait and shrimp especially when fishing over oyster beds and along mangrove shorelines.

The same technique can be used for large bait except use heavier equipment, 30 to 40lb braid and up to 50 to 60lb fluorocarbon leaders. Freelining live bait in moving water is very effective when fishing for Tarpon and large Snook. For large Tarpon increase braid up to 80lbs and use six-foot leaders up to 80lbs.

Casting and Freelining Cut Bait.

Use the same technique for cut bait as covered above for live bait. The only difference is that you can increase the size and weight of your equipment. Cut bait is allowed to sink to the bottom and fish will not see the braid or leader. Monofilament leaders may also be used when fishing with cut bait and when fishing for Tarpon increase leader weight up to 125 lbs. Using heavier gear is especially important if fishing under docks or areas with heavy debris. Add an egg sinker or use bare jig head for cut bait placed in moving water. Do not move cut bait. Wait until a fish takes the bait or the bait is relocated to another spot.
