President's Message for June 2020



Tackle Box – June 2020

June... As we begin the month of June some things have improved for our club and some have not. Our June meeting scheduled for June 4th is cancelled as is the highly anticipated "Steak Picnic". The beaches and boat ramps are open and that has created another set of concerns. Many of the East Coast boat ramps are closed or have reached their capacity early, and frustrated boaters make the trip across the state to inundate or local ramps. Captain Pete A. messaged me on Saturday of Memorial Weekend that Caxambas was out of shrimp early, and the ramp was closed. The lot was so full you could not enter. Cars and vehicles with trailers were parked all over Collier Blvd. This means our over-fished waters are even more crowded now than during season.

These "Non-Local Boaters" have extraordinarily little knowledge of our waterways. Many run aground, or damage shallow water ecosystems. Some are just idiots. For example, the father and daughter that Vic and Bobbie Ordija had to rescue when the kayakers overturned due to the wake of a large boat. The father was not wearing a life jacket and nearly drowned. The rescue put Vic and Bobbie in danger, not only from the rescue act, but exposing them to two strangers who might be carrying covid-19. What was more telling about these people was that they never even thought to thank Vic or Bobbie for their rescue.

We are at the start of the rainy season and our "Lizard Slam" event was impacted by the wet weather on the scheduled fishing day. Most of the anglers in that event fished on the Alternate Fishing Day. Be sure to read the event report in this edition. May also saw the creation of a new fishing event – The "May Month-Long Fishing Event". Yeah, we need a better name. However, 63 anglers signed-up for the event and all had fun time out on the water. It sure beat sitting in the house. Check out the event report in this edition.

On a brighter note, the Marco Sportfishing Club Board approved a donation of \$1,000 to the "Our Daily Bread" food pantry last month. In addition to the funds from the club, many members sent in personal donations, and we were able to generate close to \$4,000 in total. The food pantry was thankful for the generosity from the Club and its members.

June is the start of the "Hurricane Season". I know... like we needed another thing to worry about. Preparations for severe weather should commence now, while no storms are in the immediate forecast. Please take the time to get both your home and boat secured. Prepare an action plan in the event of a storm, including stockpiling essential survival supplies. Do this now! You all remember the shelves at the supermarkets at the end of March... can you imagine what they will be like when a storm threatens our area?

Offshore Report



Offshore Update – June 2020

First, what's happening offshore - The permit and cobia have moved in and are abundant in our local waters. The snapper spawn is on and this tends to make them very "cooperative" especially around the full moon – set up over structure or ledges where you are marking fishing and chum heavy. The red grouper are moving to shallower water this time of year...of course they are not nearly as close as they were 10 years ago so we must adapt to this new normal, I say "100 feet is the new 65". Get out there and have some fun...and be safe.

Second, a quick update on offshore fishing events - The plan for this year was for 3 events, the April Super Grouper / Snapper event was cancelled due to the virus. Conditions permitting, I am planning to schedule two more events this year. My thoughts right now are a multi species tournament mid-summer and Super Grouper / Snapper at year end. Feedback is appreciated.

On May 19th/20th MSC held our annual spring Lizard Slam. The goal of the event was to catch at least one each of a redfish, snook, and speckled trout.

26 anglers, on 14 teams fished the event. (One team registered but was not able to fish, their entry fees will be refunded.)

Except for the first-place team who had a fabulous day with a Legal Slam, big fish were hard to find! However, 3 of the 14 teams accomplished the 3-fish slam, with one other team tallying 2 of the target species.

May 2020 Month long Fishing event

Well it has come down to the wire, we have one week left in our month-long May 2020 Fishing Event. Remember it isn't over till its over. For all we know the winning fish will be caught the afternoon of May 31st. So keep on fishing, you can clean up the boat in June. Hopefully by then life will be getting back to something more like normal.

Remember the 4 Backwater Species are Redfish, Snook, Sea Trout and Sheepshead. While the 4 species in the Gulf side is Red Grouper, Permit, Cobia and Snapper (any type). Each angler can only win two prizes in each division. Since, for your sign up you can fish both Backwater and Gulf it would be possible for an individual to win four prizes, 2 backwater and 2 Gulf. Timeliness is important in that in the case of a tie the earliest receive entry wins.

At the time of this writing, I am expecting some additional entries in the Cobia, Sheepshead and Snapper categories. Because of the only Two Prizes per person per Division rule (Backwater/Gulf), it is quite likely a third or fourth place fish could be in the money.

Remember the whole Idea of this event was to get us off our couches/butts and out in the fresh air. With 63 members signed up, this is surly the largest Spring/Summer fishing event that we have ever run. Every time I have gone out, I have come back refreshed and with a smile on my face. That does not count the time my trolling motor died.

Kayak Fishing at the Fakahatchee Strand State Park by Howard Laskau

After postponing the last few months of MSC Kayak events due to bad weather and then COVID-19, I am happy to report that MSC Kayak Events are back on the schedule!

6 MSC kayakers made the trip to Fakahatchee Strand State Park (better known as The Basshole) on Tuesday, May 26th. After a few days of rain everyone was anxious and eager to get back out on the water. The bite was slow in the morning, but by late morning, things started to pick up. All the anglers started landing some small bass, and then John Baker caught a nice 19" bass (below left). That fish put him on the 2020 Kayak Fishing Challenge Leaderboard, but he wasn't there for long. A little while later, Mike Larsen landed a 24.75 inch monster that he estimated weighed about 10 pounds (below right). None of the MSC kayakers who have been coming to this venue for years can recall anyone catching a bass larger than the one that Mike caught. That fish was released back in the lake, so maybe it will grow to over 25" for the next person who catches it!

In addition to the excitement over the big bass, Gary Costly reported catching a small (10") alligator. You never know what will be on the end of your line in these freshwater lakes!

Boating Smartphone Apps

MARCO ISLAND, FL – Our lives have been forever changed by the introduction of smart phones and whether we like them or not, they do have a multitude of uses to make your boating safer and you a more knowledgeable skipper. They also have some limitations, so I would not want to rely solely on a smart phone while boating.

Just as when driving or for some of you while walking, using a cellphone while in motion is not a safe practice if you are at the helm. Things happen pretty fast on the water and the lack of brakes on a boat can get you into serious trouble if you are starring at the screen and not keeping your eyes on the water.

However, the applications (apps) written for use on the smart phone do have their place. We get asked by our students quite frequently what apps do we use or what apps we would recommend. Some are very useful here in the waters around Marco and some are niche applications that might work for a limited activity. Like anything, your personal experience with an application will be the deciding factor for whether you use it or uninstall it. Also, some apps are maintained and updated, others are not and you may find a newer app that would supersede something you have used for some time.

As a disclaimer upfront, the apps I will mention are those that I personally have found to work for me. This is not an endorsement or recommendation from Flotilla 95 nor the US Coast Guard Auxiliary nor the US Coast Guard. It is simply my personal experience.

Boating Safety

It should be no surprise that I list the **US Coast Guard** app as my favorite boating safety app. That was the design built into this application. It is available free, for both Android and iOS platforms. The app provides a very clean interface from the home screen and you can identify the boating safety laws for your home state; request a vessel safety check from the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary; determine what safety equipment you are required to carry by law; file a float plan; review the boating "rules of the road;" access weather information for your current location; report a navigational hazard; report pollution; even report suspicious activity to the Coast Guard. Plus, there is a button to use should you need emergency assistance by using your phone's GPS to send you location to the Coast Guard or connect you to 911 services.

The next two apps would be selected depending on which boating assistance company you utilize, either **BoatUS** or **SeaTow**. Like the US Coast Guard app they both utilize your phones GPS to provide them with your location. Should you not use either service provider, you can still contact them in an emergency. The benefit of using the app comes from the ability for you to add in your profile information so they have your account number coverage information. This saves you trying to find it while you are dealing with your emergency. The app can also help you file claims and find service or repair facilities nearby.

Weather

Something we all need to check before, and during, our boating day is the weather. I start watching TV weather shows well in advance of the cast-off time. But I augment that with several very useful weather applications. I like to see both the forecast and radar sweeps since our local TV stations

will report the weather for a broad area with comments like "scattered showers or thunderstorms." If I'm boating in the 10,000 Islands, knowing that Fort Myers might get rain doesn't provide me with the details I need to know if the weather will impact my plans. The following apps (and I use them all) give me regional or very localized weather depending on how I expand or focus in the screen display. Top of my list is **MyRadar**. It utilizes a map background and shows the place names. It zeros in to my current location and I can see any rain clouds from the radar. It even showed the path of the recent hurricanes. There is a full range of weather data available from the various screens. The next app is **Windy**. You see this tool used by many of the weather channels as it shows the direction and speed of the wind in a very graphic display. Once again, it uses the phone's GPS to find your location, but you can change it by pinching or expanding the screen. You can also switch from Wind to Waves or Rain. You can select a location by tapping the screen. If I wanted to know the conditions 20 miles offshore, I just need to tap the screen and it moves the reporting indicator. Windy uses the meteorological modeling tools you all heard about with the hurricanes. And you can change the model being used if you like. I do use the **Wink Weather** app but mostly for the daily forecasts, not the radar anymore as MyRadar does a far better job with that process.

Navigation

The only navigation app I use is **Navionics**. This app will turn your smart phone, or tablet, into a chart recorder. It has the marine charts displayed like any of the GPS units on a boat. It will track your trip and save it if you like. You can set routes and waypoints. I can also use it to show someone the location of an interesting place on the water, like my favorite fishing spots. There is a free version of the app and a subscription version with the latter providing higher quality charts. There's also a high definition version for use on a tablet. You could use this as your GPS on your boat, as long as you have telephone service. Depending on your type of boating this is a very useful tool.

Tides

For our waterways you better have very good tide data, or you will find yourself running out of water. One quick comment before I mention the app. Our area has some really shallow water normally. Hurricane Irma move a lot of debris and other materials during her visit to Marco and the depth reported on charts or depicted on your GPS may be very different from what is actually present today. Be very mindful of that. In addition, we experience fluctuations in our water depth in addition to the effect of the tides. The ever-present breezes on Marco move what little water we have either into the bays and backwater, or into the Gulf. You can have a high tide and yet have no water in the 10,000 Islands due to the wind. If the wind is out of the Northeast, it will push the water into the Gulf and impede its return on the incoming tide. That is why you need both a wind app and a tide app. The tide app I rely on is **Tides Charts Near Me**. I can set various locations and have the tides available for today depicted as a tidal curve image. I can also scan ahead to see what the tide will be at a specific time. I can also check days or months ahead, which is critical when planning trips into the 10,000 Islands. There is also a view that lets me choose the date and then switch back to the tidal curve view. Using this graphical display is so much better than just knowing the time when the tide is high or low.

Are there other apps folks on Marco use? Yes. Many of my friends use **FishWeather** or **NOAA Buoys** to obtain wave conditions offshore. Some also make sure they have the **FishRules** app loaded that keeps them current with what species of fish is in season and what legal size and bag limits are set for each species. You may already have a favorite that I did not list. But the ones I did

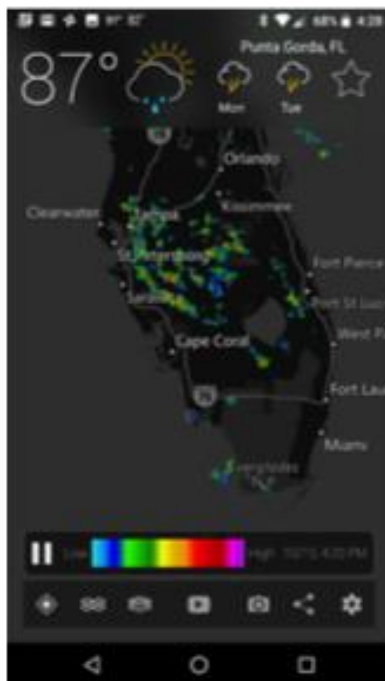
list will give you the basic information you need to become a more informed and, therefore, safer boater.

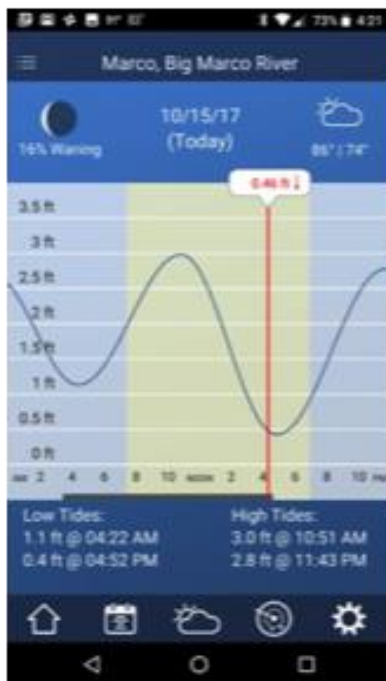

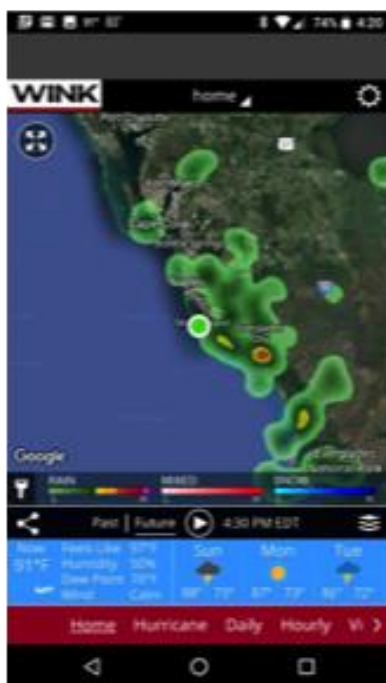

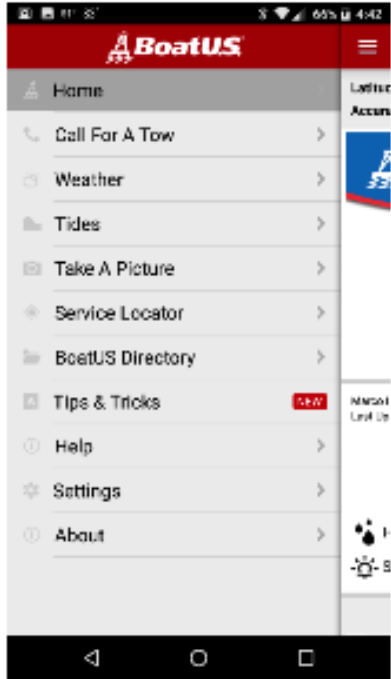
